It's that time again

Cold Weather Precautions

When starting a motorcycle in cold weather you will have problems with a wet clutch.

For those that have been riding more than a few years this has happened to you, so consider it just a reminder.

Regardless of whether or not you have an indicator that says your bike is in neutral, ALWAYS hold your clutch all the way in when starting your bike. Then let the oil warm up in the bike so the engine has enough lubrication and the clutch will work normally.

Next, and this one can save you pain and damage to the bike: ALWAYS hold your front brake (HARD) before dropping the bike into gear - even when your clutch is being held all the way in.

Because you have a wet clutch, cold weather causes your clutch oil to thicken and your clutch/flywheel tend to stick together after sitting for several hours with the engine off or riding in cold weather. Because of this, merely holding your clutch lever fully engaged is no assurance that when you drop into gear the bike will not jump forward unless you are firmly braked.

Just remember if your hands, feet, or knees are cold then the oil is also cold, and your motorcycle will operate differently. Engine power, braking, clutching, and shifting will be different in cold weather so take extra care.

Not only will a bike operate different when it's cold, our bodies do as well. Proper gear not only keeps us comfortable, but also safe. The thin gloves we wear during the day may not be warm enough to get us home at night. Really cold hands are not only uncomfortable, but also don't function as well when controlling a motorcycle. No one ever knows when they have to make that surprise navigation to avoid an obstacle. The same goes for jackets and pants. The body tends to tighten up when it's cold, thus reducing our leaning, head turning, etc. Staying warm will keep you happier, mort comfortable, but most importantly safer.
