As the new guy on the block my desire is to bring you satisfying safety articles throughout the year. Please, if you run across interesting safety related news that you would like to share with the club, feel free to bring it to my attention.

Last November our Community officer, Karen Whedon brought to our attention that Harley Davidson is extending an offer of Free Riding Academy Training to all U.S. Military.

The 'NEW' news for 2016 is that 'Extended Offer' just got BIGGER & BETTER !!!

Harley's extended program encompasses more that just a learn-toride program. It's a new salute to those who serve our country and a new salute to those who serve our community. **American Heroes Ride Free,** a free Riding Academy training for all current <u>and former</u> U.S. military, now includes first responders, Firefighters, law enforcement and EMS; plus it includes, **Operation Personal Freedom,** a new alliance with Harley's Wounded Warrior Project.

Harley-Davidson is offering a free <u>Harley-Davidson[®] Riding</u> <u>Academy</u> New Rider Course for all current and former U.S. military personnel. New for 2016 the program is now offered to first responders, including firefighters, police officers /law enforcement and emergency medical technicians (EMTs). You can register now and sign up to take an eligible course January 1, 2016 – December 31, 2016. *

In addition to the Harley-

Davidson[®] Riding Academy offer, there is an alternate offer available (see below). With this alternate offer, qualified participants will be eligible to receive a Harley-Davidson[™] Gift Card in an amount equal to the value of a course offered at an authorized Motorcycle Safety Foundation (MSF) or other state accredited riding school, upon proof of completion of a basic motorcycle riding course and a receipt.

LADIES OF HARLEY

It's February and I can't believe the weather. Snow, rain and fifty. I should be riding, but the roads are covered with

salt. Not happening.

I found an interesting article in an online mag called Ride to Live Utah. I pulled out a bit of the article to share. I always think we need to be reminded of all the safety tips we can have thrown at us. Just one may come in handy in a situation...that would mean I was successful at least once in helping keep people safe on the road.

Tips for Riding

1. Assume you are invisible to other drivers. Don't ever assume another driver knows you're there. Adhere to the attitude that no one else on the road is concerned with your personal safety. Learn to use a riding strategy like SEE (Search, Evaluate, Execute) to manage the roadway and traffic

2. Look where you want to go. It's called visual directional control. Keep your head and eyes looking 3–4 seconds ahead of you when cornering. You can get instruction and practice in this technique in a basic or advanced rider <u>training course</u>. In an emergency, do not stare at the guardrail, the gravel shoulder or the oncoming car—chances are, you'll hit whatever you're trying to avoid (this is called target fixation).

3. Use both brakes. The best way to achieve maximum braking is to apply both brakes fully without locking either wheel. Simultaneously squeeze the front brake lever and apply the rear brake pedal. Your front brake provides 70 percent or more of your stopping power in an emergency. Squeeze—do not grab—the front brake, and keep squeezing, increasing the squeezing pressure until you've slowed sufficiently or stopped. *Untrained riders are often afraid to use the front brake, for fear of flipping over.*

4. Never stop riding the bike. Don't ever give up control of your motorcycle. "Laying it down" is not a strategy. Some motorcycle brakes used to be so bad that practicing how to lay down your bike was part of learning how to ride. Today, motorcycles have anti-lock brakes, and the tires have much better traction. The ability to properly apply maximum braking power can help you avoid collisions. The person with the most control of any situation is you. Look where you want to go; countersteer or use maximum braking to avoid a crash. Food for thought! Now, your second and third thoughts coming up.

2) Please think of our vets at the VA before you come to the meeting. Bring games, black sweatshirts, beauty items and crafts...if you can think of it, they probably need it.

3) Ride planning is coming up next meeting... if you don't want to volunteer to lead a ride, at least volunteer a good place to ride.
