

ROAD CAPTAIN/SAFETY OFFICER John Kresse



As I had talked about last month, I was on a mission to cure the case of "Bagger Wobble" that my '13 Street Glide exhibited. Some Internet research found at least a dozen different devices to bolt on somewhere to solve all my troubles. Some were cheap, as in looking and cost so I didn't give them much credit. Could they have worked just fine? Maybe. But I decided that I didn't want to dive bomb this thing and spend hours under my bike swapping out different brackets etc.

So, I made a phone call to "True-Track" and talked to one of their guys. It turns out safety when riding is a pretty important thing and in particular, my safety is paramount. I decided that I wasn't going to let my bike surprise me like that

again and this was one thing I wasn't going to 'cheap out' on. The rear mechanism was \$419 and the front was \$219 but I liked the design, the materials it's made of, (6061-T6 aluminum) made in the USA and how it attaches to the bike. It's a pretty beefy mechanical arrangement.

I had the rear stabilizer mounted for the ride up to Clayton June 30th but didn't have time to install the front at that point. I can say it worked as advertised. There was a new feeling of stability in the rear end and there were no additional vibrations felt, which of course is what they told me. I had to remove my LH exhaust pipe to get access to the rear of the oil pan. It easily bolts to the frame cross member and the rear bracket replaces 5 bolts at the back of the oil pan. One added benefit is if you ever worry about bottoming out on something, like a curb, or road debris kicking up, your oil pan has a new layer of protection.

I installed the front stabilizer a few days later and got to give it a test run on the way to work this morning. It's actually a very interesting and different feeling; my Street Glide feels really tight. One thing I paid attention to was how the bike reacted when transitioning from normal road surface to a bridge deck at highway speeds. There's always a bit of a "thump-thump" and the suspension flex's a bit. I distinctly recall that I would feel a small wobble and just not pay attention to it. Now that I'm paying attention to it, I noticed that it's gone. Unfortunately, I won't have any more time before the July meeting to continue with my highway tests but it sure does look like my experiment was a success.

Please remember that this isn't something that affects every bike under every circumstance. Chances are if you've had your bike for a while and have put it through its paces and haven't experienced the "wobble" you may not experience it. So please don't ride in fear of it. Also keep in mind that it can be exasperated by aggressive riding. But if you do experience the wobble, ease off on the throttle and it should settle out. It's just like anything else and especially when you're on a motorcycle. You have to be thinking 'safety' all the time.

If anyone else would like to chat about this maybe we can hook up after the meeting.




During the month of June, we received a handful of membership renewals and new memberships as well as the Pig Pot income from the June meeting. Donuts for the meeting was our only June expense.

Packing For a Road Trip
By Eagle Rider

With American Flat Track HOG Rally behind us and the Iron Adventure of New England HOG Rally just a few weeks away, preparation for a long ride is key to success and the goal of getting ready for the ride of a lifetime is all in the preparation. You are going to experience a wide range of temperatures, weather, and road conditions. The key to enjoying yourself along the way is early preparation, planning, and effective space management. Over the years Eagle Rider has narrowed down the items that they know will make your ride an enjoyable, while ensuring you

have only what you need and then the only thing left is just thinking about is the ride and the rally.

Here are our tips for what to bring. Of course use your experience and best judgment to supplement this list.

Helmets and Communication Systems

 Bring your own personal helmet. If you require communication systems (Intercoms) please it with you.

Cold Weather Gear

- Cold Weather Jacket(s) For tours at the beginning or end of our summer riding season, we recommend a "Layering' system of base layer of wool or Capilene* (polyester) shirt, wind jacket, and cold weather jacket.
- Cold weather wind proof / waterproof pants.
- Cold weather riding boots, socks, and gloves.

Wet Weather Gear

 Weather can be unpredictable even in the warm summertime – carry a lightweight rain suit.

Warm Weather Gear

- We recommend long-sleeve white t-shirts and some type of face covering (i.e. bandana) for desert or mountain crossings.
- Swim trunks, shower sandals, long sleeve and short sleeve shirts, warm weather shorts.

Daily Use

- Personal Hygiene (toothbrush/toothpaste, comb/hairbrush, razor, tweezers, deodorant).
- Ear-plugs, Sunglasses/Eye Protection, Sunscreen (recommend 35 SPF or greater).
- Eye protection/clear glasses for evening riding or cloudy days.
- Wool or Capilene socks, underwear, gloves.
- Neck scarf for protection from neck sunburn

RX Medications

- Daily prescriptions. Note: please advise your riding friends of any special precautions or special medical conditions before and during the ride.
- Aspirin, Tylenol, Ibuprofen, eye drops, allergy medication.

Communications

- Smart Phone.
- Laptop/USB Drive (optional).
- Camera with extra batteries and storage cards.
- IPOD or other MP3 player (optional).
- Credit Cards, we recommend you notify your card companies of your travels.

*Capilene is a polyester base layer with minimal bulk, chemically treated like just about every other base layer to wick moisture faster than untreated polyester. https://www.patagonia.com/capilenepolyester-baselayer.html
