

The meeting came to order at 10:00 am with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Treasurer's Report – Joanne told us that we have \$3800 in the bank to help with the annual dinner.

Membership – Mike told us that we have 108 current members for 2019. We have 38 renewals for 2020, so if you haven't put in your application please do. If he doesn't have your birthday or mileage, please email him to make sure everything is updated. Make sure that your name is on the sign-in sheet. There will be mileage awards at the annual dinner and a drawing for two free memberships if you renew by December.

anyone's bike for that matter, it becomes a little difficult in the dead of winter, even though it sure doesn't look like it, to come up with some relevant information that would capture your interest. That being said, I'm going to wing it.

Here's something I thought that was at least... interesting. Recently, I had a couple of

CD's that I really wanted to listen to over the holiday's but they were pretty well scratched up and there was quite a bit of skipping and jumping around which is of course - annoying.

I had a crazy idea. I found my Harley Davidson Bare Metal Polish, which I use on the back wheel of my '07 Softail Custom and I remembered that I didn't recall it having any grit or fine sand in it; it's just a paste. I didn't think I had much to lose at this point so off to my workshop I went with my CD, the polish and a soft rag.

After a few minutes of rubbing the paste into the surface of the CD. I was amazed! It

was actually working! When I was done, I polished it clean with a fresh rag and applied F-11, the latest paint sealer that's supposed to do wonders for your paint job. It didn't appear to hurt the surface of a CD either. One CD made a full recovery and a second still has a pretty heavy scratch but it's one I can live with. You learn something new every day.

Once we get through the holiday party, I'm sure all thoughts will turn to spring and the

upcoming riding season. Be sure to stick around after next month's meeting for our ride planning session for the summer months. We welcome any and all ideas of places to go and things to do and see.
